

AIM Legislative Roundup - May 13, 2022

Legislatures have adjourned in more than half of the states and continue to wind down. According to the <u>tracker</u> from the National Conference of State Legislatures, 19 states remain in session with seven of those states meeting year-round. The latest count from colleagues at ASTHO indicates that 228 vaccine-related bills were introduced this year, along with a roughly equal number that carried over from last year. Of bills introduced this year, the vast majority are no longer under active consideration - with 61 failing by a vote and most of the rest not considered before adjournment. Twenty-nine bills have been enacted, and about three dozen are still pending and have passed at least one chamber.
