

Background - Colorado kindergarten vaccination rates

- Colorado Board of Health rule requires schools and childcares to report immunization and exemption data to CDPHE annually.
- School reported data show kindergarten vaccination rates in Colorado consistently below national averages.





Colorado's Public Health Detailing Program

Goal: Increase the percentage of Colorado kindergarten students protected against measles, mumps, and rubella (MMR) to 95%

- Launched as one of many initiatives in response to declining kindergarten immunization rates in Colorado
- Evidence-based strategy that works directly with clinicians by conducting a series of brief visits to provide data, resources, build relationships, and enhance clinical practice

Public Health Detailing is not:

- An audit or survey
- Intended to create more work for the clinician



Public Health Detailing program overview

12 month program cycle -

Visit 1

June 2024 - September 2024

- General overview of program
- Review key issues
- Review CIIS patient association and inactivation
- Discuss provider-level data and provide relevant reports

Visit 2

October 2024 - December 2024

- Review current provider-level data
- Review clinic progress
- Discuss kindergarten readiness and best practices
- Review school immunization law and exemptions

Visit 3

January 2025 - March 2025

- Review current provider-level data
- Review clinic progress
- Discuss CIIS best practices
- Discuss strategies to optimize CIIS functionality

Visit 4

April 2025 - June 2025

- Share final providerlevel data
- Share school-reported data, including provider's local county and school district data
- Provide additional resources



Kindergarten immunizations



Colorado Code of Colorado Regulations, 6 CCR 1009-2 Colorado law requires all students attending Colorado schools and licensed child cares to be vaccinated against certain diseases.

Prior to kindergarten entry, students between the ages of 4 through 6 years are required to receive their final doses of:

| MMR | DTaP | IPV | Varicella



Review of compliance with Colorado law

There are three ways a student can be in compliance with Colorado School immunization law

Fully Immunized

Received all school-required vaccines and has a completed Certificate of Immunization on file

Valid Exemption on File

- 1. Certificate of Medical Exemption
 Students who have a medical contraindication that
 prevents them from receiving certain school-required vaccines.
- 1. Certificate of Non- Medical Exemption May be provided by parents/guardians who are submitting an exemption to one or more school-required vaccines for nonmedical reasons.

In-Process

- Is attending school and is in the process of getting immunizations up-to-date
- 2. Has been personally notified that the student's Certificate of Immunization is not up-to-date



National and state-level data



Data Sources

National-level data source: CDC's SchoolVaxView dashboard

- Data reported annually by States to the CDC
 - state-level school reported data
- Kindergarten immunizations, exemptions, and in-process






Data Sources

State-level data source: Colorado's annual school and child care reported data dashboard

- <u>Colorado Board of Health rule</u> requires most schools and licensed child cares to report aggregate immunization and exemption data to Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment (CDPHE) annually.
- Entities that must report immunization and exemption information to CDPHE by January 15 of each year:
 - Non-exempt child care providers licensed by CDPHE to provide care to ten or more children
 - Public, private, or parochial schools (kindergarten through grade
 12)



Provider/clinic-level data



Data sources: provider-level data

Provider-level data source: clinic/provider's current CIIS patient population

- Current patient population = patients who are actively associated with the provider in CIIS (the provider is listed as their default clinic)
- Providers can identify patients actively associated with their clinic by utilizing the <u>Patient Roster</u> report



Colorado Immunization Information System (CIIS)



CIIS clinic population/patient association

Initial association


- 1. Patient receives one or more vaccines at your clinic
- 2. Vaccine information is entered into CIIS
- 3. Patient's CIIS association is automatically updated to your clinic

Association removed

- When the patient is marked as inactive
- At the request of another Colorado provider who is assuming care of the patient
- When the patient receives an immunization at a new/different clinic within the state of Colorado



When to inactivate patients in CIIS

The patient has moved out of state

- 1. Update address in CIIS (if applicable)
- 2. Inactivate patients at the clinic level
- Contact the CIIS help desk to remove the patient at the jurisdiction level (if applicable i.e., patient is moving out of Colorado)

The patient is lost to follow-up

- Clinic has attempted to contact the patient 3x in the past 365 days without response
- The patient has not received any vaccines within the last 365 days

The patient is inactive

 No longer under the associated clinic/provider's care
