2024 was a special year for me as it marked both 20 years as AIM's Executive Director and 25 years of existence for the AIM organization. I am continually honored to serve and direct our community of immunization program managers!

2024 was also a landmark year in the immunization community as we celebrated 30 years of the Vaccines for Children (VFC) program. The VFC program is credited with saving more than 1.1 million lives and averting more than 32 million hospitalizations. Its success is rooted in the strong partnership between the federal, state, and local levels and between private healthcare providers and public health. AIM has been proud to support the progression of program managers in their leadership and implementation of the VFC entitlement program over the last two+ decades.

In 25 years, AIM has grown from a concept to a robust community – a place where those who choose to serve the public by preventing disease through vaccination can learn, grow, and thrive. While recent times presented AIM members with funding cuts, vaccinepreventable disease outbreaks, and other challenges, our members were able to navigate this with grit and expertise. The passion our members, staff, and partners have for improving the lives of all those in our communities has cemented AIM's enduring and successful legacy!


Our Work

Webinars

In 2024, AIM strengthened the member community through the planning, development, and facilitation of:

Member Meetups

A weekly informal video call for program managers to chat about hot topics, give feedback on new policies or issues, and brainstorm solutions to shared challenges.

Small Group Meetups

Monthly informal meetings for the United States Affiliated Pacific Islands (USAPI) program managers and for city jurisdiction program managers.

Peer Connect

A program that connects new program managers with seasoned program managers, providing opportunities for sharing advice, ideas, and activities. In 2024, AIM matched 10 new members with experienced members.

In-person Connection

Networking events at conferences and Vaccine Access Cooperative (VAC) meetings that strengthen peer relationships.

Program Manager Knowledge Hub

A peer-led webinar series with a short presentation from members and then an open discussion. 2024 topics included:

- Redesigning workflows
- Optimizing immunization information systems (IIS)
- Transitioning COVID-19 to routine programming

AIM provided training and educational opportunities for members to build and expand their professional skills. AIM offered regular webinars on various subjects for both program managers and their immunization program staff.

General Membership Webinars

AIM hosted these monthly for members to engage with peers, discuss hot topics, and learn updates about relevant AIM activities.

Vaccine Confidence

Members learned from guest speakers about sustaining community-based partnerships to build vaccine confidence.

Leadership Development

Members learned from guest speakers about effective leadership and emotional intelligence. In 2024, AIM hosted three leadership trainings.

Emerging Issues

AIM worked with federal staff, peer organizations, and corporate partners throughout the year to provide webinars on new guidance, products, and emerging issues.



Membership Resources & **Services**

AIM developed and disseminated timely high-quality resources and services for its members. In 2024, AIM focused on collecting and disseminating updates and analysis on the latest vaccination guidance, developing resources for immunization programs, and providing members with peertested tools and lessons learned.

Resource highlights from the past year included:


- Plain language summaries of Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) and Vaccines and Related Biological Products Advisory Committee (VRBPAC) meetings.
- Program practices that detail replicable ideas from members.
- A library of plug-and-play media assets for education campaigns focusing on new and expecting parents and infant vaccinations.
- A new learning management system, Reach 360, with a collection of five e-modules about COVID-19 vaccination topics.
- A handout for birthing institutions on the benefits of enrolling in VFC and guidance on how to participate.
- Reports on lessons learned from AIM projects and initiatives, including iREACH and the Pediatric VAC meetings.
- Social media templates for immunization-related national observances.



Policy & Influence

AIM serves as a voice for immunization programs at the national level and a resource for jurisdictions as they navigate legislative sessions at the state level. From federal policy advocacy to national media outlets to local and state coalitions, the needs of members are shared with decisionmakers and the broader public. In 2024, AIM's policy and government relations team:

- Outlined the critical role of the 317 Program, highlighted successes, and identified needed resources by creating AIM's Section 317 Immunization Program Funding Fact Sheet. Submitted testimony to the U.S. Congress that made the case, on the record, for increased investment in Section 317. Disseminated infographics depicting AIM's advocacy priorities educated vaccine partners, interested parties, and policymakers.
- Celebrated the 30th anniversary of the VFC program, recognizing immunization programs' roles in saving over 1.1 million children's lives. The virtual celebration featured current and former VFC leadership.
- Wrote AIM's first peer-reviewed manuscript, co-authored with the CDC, which featured state and local practices encouraging pediatric COVID-19 vaccination of children ages 6 months through 11 years.
- Tracked state legislative trends, produced a summary report analyzing all vaccine-related legislation from the 2023-2024 state sessions, and conducted a pre-legislative session webinar to help program managers better understand and respond to the state policy landscape. Sent bi-weekly state legislative updates and a bill analyses template that assisted with data-driven messaging on commonly introduced bills.
- Shared AIM's expertise and engaged in multiple coalitions, increasing AIM's visibility, influence, and effectiveness.
 Examples include the 317 Coalition, Adult Vaccine Access Coalition (AVAC), the Coalition to Stop Flu, Vaccinate Your Family Policy Group, and the Infectious Disease Prevention Network.
- Participated in two federal advisory committees as a liaison organization: ACIP and the National Vaccine Advisory Committee (NVAC). AIM members served on ACIP working groups, which ensured inclusion of the program perspective and implementation challenges in the recommendation process.



Project Highlight: Adult Vaccine Access Cooperative Meetings

AIM convened eight regional meetings of the Vaccine Access Cooperative (VAC) from May through July 2024 to focus on improving adult vaccination rates. VAC brought together leaders to develop strategies to break down barriers to effective adult vaccination programs.

Attendees included representatives from:

- Departments of health
- Immunization programs
- Medicaid programs
- Pharmacist associations
- Long-term care facilities
- The American Academy of Family Physicians (AAFP)
- Immunization coalitions
- And other key immunization partners

AIM also conducted listening sessions with program managers during the VAC meetings to better understand and document lessons learned from the pediatric COVID-19 vaccine roll-out. Findings were published in a summary report and used to inform public comments on the Vaccine National Strategic Plan.



Project Highlight: Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV) Prevention

AIM, in collaboration with CDC, launched a Learning Collaborative in 2024 to increase the capacity of immunization programs to equitably protect infants from serious illness and death due to RSV. The collaborative's goal was to increase birthing hospital participation in the VFC program and provide the opportunity for every newborn to be protected from RSV disease. Efforts will continue throughout 2025 to see the impact on birthing institutions' enrollment in VFC to provide the RSV immunization during the birth stay.

AIM hosted two Learning Collaborative discussions to understand the challenges to birthing hospital participation in the VFC program and how VFC vaccine replacement models have been successfully implemented in birthing hospitals to improve VFC program participation.

AIM also hosted three highly attended webinars about:

- Understanding nirsevimab allocation
- Planning for the 2024-2025 RSV season
- Enrolling birthing institutions in the VFC program

Event Highlight: 2024 AIM Leadership in Action Conference

AIM held the 2024 Leadership in Action Conference in New Orleans, LA. Attendees received leadership development and training, celebrated inspirational peers with AIM awards, and connected with the immunization community at networking events.

Dr. Demetre Daskalakis, director of the CDC's National Center for Immunizations and Respiratory Diseases (NCIRD), was the opening plenary speaker. He highlighted how the work of immunization managers across the country, through every day public health efforts and routine immunization, is critical for outbreak response and pandemic preparedness.



In addition to three days of timely and member-valued educational programming, AIM celebrated its 25th Anniversary with a reception and a classic New Orleans-style second line in the French Quarter.

AIM also piloted a post-conference training, Successful Program Management-Utilizing Program Effectiveness Principles. Program managers explored how to incorporate program effectiveness in grant writing, programmatic activities, evaluation, and reporting.






AIM FY 2024 Year Ending September 30, 2024 Total Revenue: \$7,735,859
