



## AIM Legislative Round-up: June 5, 2026

Most state legislative activity has concluded across the country for this year's cycle, so this will be AIM's final Legislative Round-up of the year. AIM is tracking **446 bills** that were prefilled, introduced, or advanced in the legislative process since August 1 that could impact immunization programs. An overview of legislative movement over the last two weeks is provided below. AIM's full cumulative state legislative report for 2025/2026 will be released in Fall 2026. ### Enacted: 3 Resolutions

- [IL HR 803](#) establishes June 28, 2026, as Hepatitis B Awareness Day, noting the importance of vaccination efforts
- [IL HR 810](#) establishes July 10, 2026, as Vaccine Awareness Day and urges the health department to take various vaccine promotion actions
- [LA SCR 37](#) requests that the surgeon general develops a report relative to informed consent for vaccinations

### Passed 2nd Chamber: 3 Bills

- [IL SB 3487](#) requires that hospitals offer influenza vaccinations and pneumococcal vaccinations to all those eligible at discharge (currently only those 50+ and 65+ respectively); jointly stating that state vaccine guidelines supersede the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) in the event such recommendations differ
- [LA HB 775](#) specifies that minors can't consent to their own medical care until age 17 with few exceptions, specifically noting their inability to consent to vaccinations to prevent sexual transmitted infections
- [NH HB 1449](#) states that vaccine clinics cannot operate at schools during school hours, except for influenza vaccines or during a public health emergency

### Passed 1st Chamber: 4 Bills

- [CA AB 2651](#) would require that parents or guardians of enrolled pupils be notified when an immunization rate at that school or institution has fallen below the rate needed to prevent the spread of disease
- [NY S 2516](#) would establish a refugee resettlement program, including (amongst other services) providing immunizations for this population
- [NY S 4583](#) would specify care required for incarcerated pregnant women, including timely access to vaccinations
- [RI SB 2379](#) would allow the director of the health department, not just ACIP, to determine vaccines that must be covered by insurers without cost-sharing

### Other Legislative Movement: 7 Bills

- **Seven** bills that were previously introduced had some other form of legislative movement, short of passing the entire chamber (i.e., additional readings, additional cosponsors, committee assignments, and/or committee votes)
